CVE In Canada: In Theory and in Practice

Uwe F. Waeber

In my brief opening remarks I will quickly review the history and nature of CVE in the Canadian context, identify the basic aspects of CVE programming in general and the problematic aspects of CVE in the environment, and then review the evolution of CVE programming. Rebecca Skelton is a Senior Program Manager at the Intelligence and Security Dialogue (ISD) managing the Strategic Network (SCN). The SCN is the first global network of civil society organizations including major international NGOs and academic institutions in building social cohesion and community resilience to counter violent extremism in the Pacific. Rebecca worked on the front line of the UK counterterrorism efforts in the UK and London borough. She has extensive experience in developing local CVE programming and public awareness. Rebecca is also a member of the UK Department for Education's Education Advisory Panel for Extremism.

Jeff Thomson is a police officer in the King's Police in Kingston, Ontario and has been involved in a number of cases. He has worked in the Criminal Investigation Division in the Sexual Assault and Child Abuse Unit. While there, Jeff became a liaison officer conducting cross-border admissible evidence of victims and acted as a liaison officer for the CID. Jeff worked on the Special Service Division where he has been involved in conducting surveillance and investigation in the field and fighting. While in his role, Jeff has recorded a number of incidents in his federal government Liaison Office for a number of months before being assigned to the Special Service Division where he has led the investigation for the King's Police in his involvement in the investigation. He has also acted in a number of cases dedicated to combating human trafficking. As of January, he is working on a number of cases in the region.

Jeff completed his undergraduate degree at Queen's University in Kingston and while there he earned a number of awards. He worked for the Centre for the Study of Democracy. While at the CSD, he has been involved in the democratic education project for the development of a democratic education program in Ukraine. Jeff is currently a Lecturer in the Department of Queen's University. He has also worked for the Department of International Studies. The focus will be on the global implications of conflict and the funding of organized crime groups and the role of the network.

In his spare time, Jeff works as a consultant for the Canadian Security Intelligence Agency (CSIS) and the Canadian Forces and other departments in his federal government.
