On the pension front, there is positive news to report: for the first eight months of this pension year (September 1, 2016, to April 30, 2017) the investment return on the plan's assets was +7.66%. De-

spite the ups and downs of markets, the investments produced another net gain over last month. We hope (but cannot guarantee) that the remaining four months of the pension year will produce added gains.

Negotiations on a multi-university pension plan are continuing, led by employee unions and administra-
