

This document provides the governance fram kwicour graduate studies resulting from the governance changes to the School of Graduate Stadid Research that were approved by the Senate of Queen's University on February 26, 2009. This document replaces structure of the School of Graduate Studies and Reste Queen's University at Kingst (hast revision date September 24, 1998 and approved at the October 1998 meeting of Queen's Senate).

# Governing Framework for Graduate Studies Queen's University

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# Background

This document provides the governance fram kw/corr graduate studies resulting from the governance changes to the School of Graduate Stadid Research that were approved by the Senate of Queen's University on February 20009 (see Appendix One). This document replaces the Constitution of the School Of raduate Studies and Research, eQu's University at Kingston (last revision date September 24, 1998 and care at the October 22,998 meeting of Queen's Senate).

In 1943, the Senate constituted the Queen's defaity Board of Graduate Studies. This was reconstituted into the chool of Graduate Studies in 1968 dexpanded to include the research component in 1971. In 1990, the increasing important for esearch led to the creation of a joint position of Dean of Graduate Studies and Virtue cipal (Research). This continued until 1995, when a separate portfolio of Vice in the component (Research) as established.

The School of Graduate Studiess Research næmreflected the jurisdictions over which the graduate school had responsitivitiand authority when it was established. Following the creation of the Vice-Principal (Research) ortfolio, the responsibility for all aspects of the research enterprise, exclusive of graduate student responsibility for all aspects of the interests of providing clarity and being accurate SGSR was renamed the School of Graduate Studies as part of governance changes append by Senate in February 2009.

In November 2007, the position of Dean, GraduSatudies and Research, was expanded to include the responsibilities and title of Associa/tice-Principal and DearGraduate Studies and Research (now, AVP/Dean, SGS) to reflect this/earsity wide scope of graduate education at Queen's.

# Purpose of the SGS

Under the auspices of Senate, the SchoQiraduate Studies (SGB) concert with the Faculties/Schools is responsible to conduct of graduate studietsQueen's University. Its mandate is to support student achievementistems with the highest possible academic standards in graduate degree praces and to foster excellencegraduate studemesearch. It fulfills the mandate in collaboration wiffaculties/School through the development and implementation of appropriate regulations andraping procedures for admissions, programs of study, and completion of degree requirements and through the support of graduate students. Specific responsibilities follow:

- x Setting policy concerning all graduate (mæstend doctoral) degree programs, graduate certificate and diploma programs within itsisudiction and subject to the authority of Senate;
- x Making recommendations to the Senate taredVice-Principal (Academic) concerning the development and operation of graduate studies and graduate education;
- x Ensuring adherence to program quality assurance standards;

- x Ensuring adherence to institutional and external program approval and on-going audit requirements;
- x Ensuring compliance with provincial governmeetgulations as they relate to program quality, program approval, and ogram funding requirements;
- x Graduate enrollment planning and management;
- x Working with graduate programs to decore and support recitionent strategies;
- x Admission of students to graduate degree programs and qualifying students for subsequent admission to graduate degree programs;
- x Supporting graduate student achievement;
- x Monitoring the progress of graduatedents at the univerty, overseeing the maintenance of academic standards, recommending to Senate the awarding of graduate degrees;
- x Appointing and convening the Fellowship Committee;
- x Appointing and convening the Ademic Appeal Board;
- x Managing Queen's graduate student awards;
- x The publication of the Calendar of the Sch**aol**d of all official publications concerning graduate work within the urisdiction of the School.

The design, implementation and oversight of **grate** curriculum is **a**hared responsibility between the Graduate Studies Executive **Cib**(see below) and the Faculty Graduate Councils/Committees (see below).

# The Graduate Studies Exective Council (GSEC)

The Role of the Graduate Studies Executive Council

GSEC performs the following functions:

- x Ensures that the Faculty Graduate Councids/Chittees establish and follow appropriate procedures to carry out the esponsibilities associated with graduate programs within the Faculty/School;
- x Reviews and revises departmental and facely lations pertaining to graduate studies in their areas, in matters related but not limited to: admissions standards for graduate studies, graduate degree requirements, peggthrough the graduate degrees, completion of degree requirements, appeals of graduate students;
- x As appropriate, refers new programs faculty Graduate Councils/Committees for consideration and discussion;
- x Reviews program proposals from Faculty Graduate Councils/Committees for recommendation to University Senate;
- x As needed, appoints sub-committees to detail is is related tograduate studies;
- x Advises the Dean or Associate Deansmutters affecting graduate studies;
- x Considers matters referred to it by the Deaffaculty Graduate Councils/Committees;
- x Considers matters referred to it the Standing Committees of GSEC;
- x Considers matters referred to it bynSte and/or committees of Senate;
- x Reviews and approves decisions, aguineed, made at Faculty Graduate Councils/Committees

x Calls and organizes a Forum of all memboding SGS at least 2 times per academic session. The AVP/Dean of the SGS will vseas Moderator of this Forum.

Decisions made by GSEC are either recommender provided as information to Senate and Senate subcommittees as required by SGS or unive

School shall be a member of the graduate committee. The Associate Dean (Graduate) of the Faculty serves as Chair. The non-departmized faculties' Graduate Committees will function with the same responsibilities the faculty Graduate Counciles like those Councils, are subject to the oversight of GSEC as required.

### SGS Fellowship Committee

The Fellowship Committee is responsible for the following:

- x Adjudication of applications and competitions for University fellowships, scholarships and awards, and for external fellowship competitions as required
- x Reporting its decisions to GSEC
- x Subject to the authority of the Senatepproving and determining the terms and condition of awards of fellowships, scholapshand prizes establed in the SGS, and amend the conditions of award of a dellowships, scholarships or prizes established in the School, due regaring geiven to the wishes of the donor
- x Submitting annually to GSEC for approverschedule governing the awarding of fellowships during the following year

Members include:

- x The AVP and Dean and Assignte Deans of the SGS
- x Representatives from each of the Faculty Graduate Councils
- x Representatives from each non-departmalized Faculty Graduate Committee

Two graduate students, who are members of the SGS, to be named by the Society of Graduate and Professional Students, shall be Associatebrees; except for meetings devoted to the awarding of fellowships, which they may noteend, the student Associate members shall have full membership privileges.

The Fellowship Committee elects its vn Chair annually. A seniorfficer of the SGS serves as Secretary to the committee. The Second base not have a vote on the committee.

### SGS Academic Appeal Board

The fairness or consequences of academic assessments, decisions or regulations may be appealed. Course marks or examination committee is ions cannot be overturned but alternative actions (including the possibility further examinations) may emandated. Appeal procedures are published in the Calendar of the SGS.

The Academic Appeal Board decision is final with only exception being the right of further appeal to the Senate Grievance Board whe appeal is based on ground sunfair procedures or allegations of bias.

The SGS appoints the following to be more soft an appeal board panel:

x Representatives from each Faculty Gradu@committee, and alternates from each Faculty Graduate Committee (from departreedifferent than the principal members) nominated by the Dean of the Faculty/School.

Senate Committee on Academic Development Report to Senate – Meeting of February 26, 2009

Final Report to Senate on the Recommendations for Governance of the School of Graduate Studies and Research

#### Introduction

The Senate Committee on Academic/Blepment (SCAD) reviewed the recommendations of the SCAD Sub-Committee review of the Governance Structure of the School of Graduate Studies and Research (SGSR) at its meetings of November 26, 2008 and January 21, 2009. J. De Alsisociate Vice-Principal and Dean of SGSR, B. Brouwer, Associate Dean Sold SR, and M.Corbett, Director, Admissions and Student Services for SGSR, attended the tings to speak to the recommendations and to answer any questions from the mbers of SCAD. The document entitled "Recommendations for Governance of the Schod Graduate Studies and Research" is attached as Appendix A.

#### Background and Mandate

The Sub-Committee for the Review of **tGe**vernance Structure of the SGSR was established in early 2006 and the Term**Ref**erence of the Sub-Committee and its membership are attached as Appendix B.

From February 2006 to February 2007e Sub-Committee engaged in a period of review, research and analysis, whichlinded consultation with: Faculty Deans; Directors of the Schools of Policy Stediand Urban and Regional Planning; representatives of the Setty of Graduate and Professional Students (SGPS); and, Queen's University Post-Dubaral Fellows Association.

An Interim Report was presented to Senattites meeting of September 20, 2007. In October 2007, SCAD undertook a process teck sheroad consultatin with members of the Queen's community. The Chair of SCADught the services of a consultant who

- Dean of SGSR;
- Associate Deans of SGSR (2);
- A senior staff representative from the SGSR;
- Associate Deans offee Faculties (6);
- Chairs of the Graduate Councils (4);
- SGPS President or delegate (1);
- Graduate Student Senator (1).

B. That the existing Divisional structube replaced by Faculty-based Graduate Councils. For departmentalized Facultinese, mbership in these Councils should include at least the following:

- all graduate coordinators of agruate programs within the Faculty;
- an Associate Dean of the Faguassigned by the Faculty office;
- an Associate Dean of the SG assigned to that Faculty;
- SGPS graduate student from the faculty;
- a senior staff representative from the SGSR.

C. That the SGSR be renamed Studies (SGS).

\*SCAD recommends that the Vice-Principal (Academic) attend separately to the following:

• responsibility, authority, accountability and resources for interdisciplinary graduate programs;

• location of the School of Urban and gramal Planning and the School of Policy Studies;

• an administrative solution that addresses the unique requirements and status of Post-doctoral Fellows durintgeir tenure at Queen's.

Role of the Graduate Studies Executive Council

• Responsible for reviewing and revising the ratio of the School of Graduate Studies and Research

- makes recommendations to Grate@ouncils regarding new programs
- appoints sub-committees to deal with issued at to graduate studies as needed
- advises the Dean or Associate Dean on matters affecting graduate studies
- consider matters referred to it by the DearGraduate Councils -Review and approve decisions made at Faculty Councils

Decisions made by the Graduate Studies Execution are forwarded to Senate as required by SGSR or university regulations.

#### Rationale:

The purpose of the Executive Council would been place the existing Council and Steering Committees of the SGSR with a more stread, effective body, which also embraces the participation of the Faculties its decision making and discussions.

The GSEC would have representing from all Faculty offices (trough their Associate Deans) and from all Graduate Councils (through their Operisons). This combination of expertise and representation would make the body have the presentation and well-informed in its decision-making.

This structure keeps the administrative worlgood duate studies with the SGSR but with significant Faculty representation. A streamlined centralized decrisidering body is necessary to the effectiveness of any strategianphing of graduate studies at Queen's.

#### Recommendation #2

The existing Divisional structure beplaced by Faculty-based Graduate Councils. For departmentalized Faculties, membersimithese Councils would be comprised of the following:

- all graduate coordinators of agruate programs within the Faculty,
- an Associate Dean of the Faguassigned by the Faculty office,
- an Associate Dean of the SB assigned to that Faculty
- SGPS graduate student from the Faculty
- A senior staff representative from the SGSR

Role of the Faculty-based Councils

The business of the Faculty Graduate Counvoids droughly parallel the current work of Division, and would probably inclued tasks such as the following:

• Shall formulate council speec regulations for approval by Graduate Studies Executive Council (GSEC)

- shall present calendar submissions to GSEC
- shall recommend to the GSEC, for degrees, those who have fulfilled the requirements

• shall make recommendations to the GSERCany matters referred to them by the Council

• shall have the authority to recommend the GSEC that a student be required to withdraw from the School on academic grounds

• shall make recommendations to GSEC on it in roduction or termination of graduate courses proposed by Departments

• shall elect representatives to Sentate, Fellowship Committee and the Academic Appeal Board

• may make recommendations to the Cou**coi**cerning matters of policy and degree programs

• may make recommendations to Departtseconcerning members of supervisory committees

In the case of the Faculty of Arts & Scientweo Graduate Councils re recommended: one for Humanities and Social Science programs, one for Na

# Appendix Two

#### Membership and Associate Membership, SGS

#### Members

DEFINITION: members of faculty of the University of professorial rank, who are tenured, tenure track or on a continuinage junct appointment appropriety appointed to a graduate department/graduate program, including retired faculty from graduate departments or graduate programs who have received the title Professor Emeritus from the University.

ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES: Members shall, where required, act as the sole or major supervisor of doctoral and master's theses and as a member of thesis committees; serve as chair or voting member of final oral examination committees, where such examinations are required by SGS, and perform all dutiessociated therewith; assume responsibility for the setting and marking of comprehensive (general) exartions; teach, set and mark examinations for graduate courses and give such other directionation duate students as may be required. The Head or Director may place further requirements initations on the activities of a member

If the Head of the graduate department/paorgagree, members emeriti shall be permitted to serve as a chair of final oral examinations anclatory out one or more of the following: serve as a member of thesis committees and as a voting bree of final oral examinations; teach, set and mark examinations for graduate courses; messuesponsibility for steing and marking of comprehensive (general) examinations; continueerve as a sole or major supervisor of doctoral or master's theses; take new master's or doctoral copservision with the approval of the Graduate Chair or Director/Head of Department. The Head or Director may place further requirements or limitations on the taxities of a member emeritus.

#### **Associate Members**

DEFINITION: Associate Members are members **of Un**iversity who engage in advanced level research but do not hold an apptonient that qualifies for membership of the SGS. They are nominated by the Head or Director of any graduate department or graduate program of the School. Associate membership must be appropriet Associate Vice-Principal and Dean of the SGS.

ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES Associate members may undertable the duties of a full member but do not serve as a sole or majpers visor, whether formally or otherwise, of doctoral students and do not ast the chair of finadoctoral oral examinations. The Head or Director may place further requirements or lintidas on the activities of an Associate Member.

## **Appendix Three**

### Areas of Responsibility for Executive Officers of the SGS

The Associate Vice-Principal and Dean, School of Graduate Studies

The Associate Vice-Principal anDean, School of Graduate Studies the chief executive officer of the School and is responsible to the Vice Principal (Acaedinic). The AVP and Dean is responsible for the following:

- x Direct, in co-operation with the appropriate Graduate Faculties Councils/Committees, Faculties, Schools, Institutes and Departmethtsgeneral policy of the SGS so as to maintain and improve the quality of **glue** te scholarship and research in the University
- x Advise concerning the interests of to academic appointments to the University by consultation with the Facu Deans, more especially in the case of appointments of Heads of Departments and Directors of Gelmstitutions, and Schools
- x Advise the Vice Principal (Academic) reg**arg** matters relating to the operation and welfare of the SGS
- x The operation of the administrative office of the SGS
- x Report to the Vice Principal (Academic), **Se**nate and to GSEC on the state of all matters relating to graduate studies
- x Act as a member and Chair of GSEC
- x Act as the University representative on CAGS and OCGS
- x Recommend to the Vice-Principal (Academic) faculty members for the positions of Associate Deans, SGS
- x Assign responsibilities/duties to the Assate Deans, SGS and shall see that all members of the SGS are notifief these responsibilities
- x Assign responsibilities/duties to the senior officers of the SGS and shall see that all members of the SGS are notifief these responsibilities
- x Upon a recommendation from the Head oreDior of a gradute department or program, or the Chair of a Faculty Greate Council/Committee, shall have the authority to recommend to Senate the agraduate student withdraw on academic grounds

Associate Deans, SGS

- x Responsible for the duties assigned by the AVP & Dean
- x Act for and on behalf of the Deadwring the absence of the AVP& Dean
- x Members of GSEC
- x Members of the Faculty Gdaate Councils/Committees

# Appendix Four

### Graduate Departments: Roles and Responsibilities

A Department of the SGS is a Department, Programment, School, Institutor Faculty that has been authorized by the SGS and Queen's University ate to offer programs of study leading to graduate degrees.

#### Each Department

- x Makes recommendations for admission to the logate programs in the Department to the SGS, in accordance with departmental, See S. Faculty/School policies and procedures;
- x Develops and delivers graduate courses of instruction, appoints supervisory committees, and where appropriate, appointdividual supervisors;
- x Conducts departmental examinations **ads**tits, determines the results of such examinations, and report the results of such examinations as required by the university;
- x Informs students of possible means of financial support and ntersistaudents, with ranking if need be, for University directernal fellowships and awards;
- x Is responsible for regulating the progress **e**f**gh**aduate students in the department and for reporting as required the passing (**o**llufræ) of all departmental graduate degree requirements by their students;
- x With the support of the SGS, prepare doeute for internal and external quality assurance review
- x Is aware of, conforms to, and ensures splipance with regulations of the School.

Departments make recommendations to their appiate Faculty Graduate Council, or Faculty Graduate Committee, as required by all **velte** governing regulations, concerning:

- x Regulations and requirements relating to the degree programs in the Department and any changes to same;
- x Admission standards and policies of graduce gree programs the Department and any changes to same;
- x Course revisions including creating new coest, and changes to the Programs of Study for the graduate degrees in the department;
- x Requests for students to proceed from a master's program directly into a doctoral program;
- x Requests that a student bquized to withdraw based on rtagin circumstances outlined in the General Regulations of SGS.

Departments make recommendations their appropriate Associate an of SGS or other senior officer of SGS as required, concerning:

x Any proposed exemptions from regulationsapplying to currenindividual graduate students (e.g. residency requirements, eidensif time limits, course substitutions, and performance requirements)

x Requests that a student bquized to withdraw, based onrtagin circumstances outlined in the General Regulations 8GS, distinct from those cases reviewed by the Faculty Graduate Councils/Committees.
