Proposal to Change the Composition of the Aboriginal Council of Queen's University Report to the Senate May 25, 2011

BACKGROUND

The establishment of the Council on Aboriginal Issues, now known as the Aboriginal Council of Queen's University, was approved by the Senate on November 26, 1992.

The purpose of the Council as stated in its terms of reference is "to ensure that for generations hereafter Aboriginal peoples will have access to higher education at Queen's University, and that the institution will be responsive to the broader needs of Aboriginal peoples."

The attached report and proposal to change the Council's composition was submitted on behalf of the Council by C. Davis, Vice-Principal (Finance and Administration) and Co-Chair of the Aboriginal Council. The Council has determined that it could discharge its duties more effectively by reducing its members from 44 to 24, while retaining the representative nature of its composition.

Also attached is a letter of support for the Proposal to Change the Composition of the Aboriginal Council of Queen's University from the Senate Educational Equity Committee.
