The School of Policy Studies at Queen's University invites applications from suitably qualified candidates interested in teaching a course in Ethics in the Public Service (MPA 826). This is an in-person teaching, graduate course with an expected enrolment of 40 students. Candidates should have a M.A. or M.Sc. or Ph.D, and teaching experience at the university level in a relevant area. This is a winter term appointment for the period January 1, 2025, to April 30, 2025, with classes in session from January 6, 2025 to April 4, 2025.

The University invites applications from all qualified individuals. Queen's is strongly committed to employment equity, diversity and inclusion in the workplace and encourages applications from Black, racialized/visible minority and Indigenous people, women, persons with disabilities, and 2SLGBTQ+ persons. All qualified candidates are encouraged to apply; however, in accordance with Canadian immigration requirements, Canadian citizens and permanent residents of Canada will be given priority.
